## **Author Guideline**

Authors submitting manuscripts to the *International Journal of Advances and Applications in Convergent Studies & Transdisciplinary (IJ-AACST)* are expected to follow the journal's guidelines carefully. Submissions not adhering to these guidelines may be returned for revision before review.

### A. Manuscript Structure

Authors are required to prepare their manuscripts in the following order. Each section must be clearly identified with appropriate headings and subheadings.

#### 1. Title of the Paper

- Should be concise, specific, and informative (12–20 words preferred).
- Avoid abbreviations, formulas, or jargon unless essential.

#### 2. Author(s) Details

- Full name(s) of all authors.
- Institutional affiliation(s) with department, university/organization, city, and country.
- Official email address of each author.
- Use ORCID iD if available; if not, we strongly recommend creating one for better author identification, global visibility, and standardized academic record management. You can register for free at <a href="https://orcid.org">https://orcid.org</a>
- Clearly indicate the Corresponding Author with an asterisk (\*) and provide complete
  contact details.

### 3. Abstract (The Abstract should be preceded and followed by a single rural/line)

- Length: 150–250 words.
- Written as a **single paragraph** without citations.
- Should be structured to include:
  - o **Purpose/Objective** of the study

#### 4. Keywords

- Provide **3–6 keywords or phrases**.
- Arrange alphabetically, separated by commas.
- Use standardized academic terms (avoid overly general words).
- Keywords help in indexing and discoverability. Avoid general terms and include fieldspecific terminology.

#### 5. Main Text

The manuscript should follow this logical sequence:

#### **5.1 Introduction**

- Present background, context, and rationale of the study.
- State the problem, research gap, and objectives.

#### 5.2 Literature Review / Related Work

- Summarize relevant previous studies.
- Critically analyze existing knowledge and position your research.

#### 5.3 Methodology

- Explain research design, data sources, sampling, tools, and techniques used.
- Ensure reproducibility by providing sufficient detail.

#### 5.4 Results and Discussion

- Present findings clearly (use tables, figures, charts where necessary).
- Interpret results, compare with existing studies, and highlight implications.

# **5.5 Conclusion and Future Scope**

- Summarize key contributions.
- Highlight limitations and suggest directions for future research.

#### 6. References

- All works cited in the manuscript must appear in the reference list.
- Use a **consistent style** (APA / IEEE / MLA / Chicago, depending on discipline).

- References should be complete with author(s), year, title, journal/book, volume/issue, pages, DOI/URL (if applicable).
- Examples:

#### **APA Style:**

Smith, J. A. (2021). *Digital learning in higher education*. Journal of Educational Technology, 15(3), 45–60. https://doi.org/xxxx

### **IEEE Style:**

[1] A. B. Author, "Title of paper," *Journal Name*, vol. 10, no. 2, pp. 45–53, 2020.

## 7. Acknowledgment (Optional)

- Mention financial support, institutional assistance, or individuals who contributed but do not qualify for authorship.
- Example: "The authors acknowledge funding support from XYZ University Research Grant (No. 1234/2023)."

## 8. About the Author(s) (Optional)

- Provide a short biography (50–100 words per author).
- Include current designation, research interests, and major achievements.
- Author photographs may be included if required by the journal.

# E. Length Guidelines

- Original Research Articles: 5,000–8,000 words
- Review Papers: 6,000–10,000 words
- Short Communications / Technical Notes: 1,500–3,000 words

- Authors should ensure originality (plagiarism below acceptable threshold i.e. <=10%, as per journal policy).
